

Milton L. Mueller

Milton Mueller is Professor at the Georgia Institute of Technology School of Public Policy, USA. His teaching and research focuses on the political economy of communication and information.

He is the Director of the Internet Governance Project and the author of three seminal books on Internet governance, *Ruling the Root* (2002), *Networks and States* (2010) and *Will the Internet Fragment?* (2017).

Currently, he is doing research on digital trade policy, cybersecurity and Internet governance, the security governance practices of ISPs; and the IPv6 transition.

As a co-founder of ICANN's Noncommercial Users Constituency, he has played a leading role in organizing and mobilizing civil society in ICANN, the Internet Governance Forum and OECD. From 1998-2015 he was Professor at the Syracuse University School of Information Studies.

Mueller received the Ph.D. from the University of Pennsylvania's Annenberg School in 1989.
