David is a sixth-year PhD student and Graduate Research Assistant at George Mason University Schar School of Policy and Government, a Google Policy Fellow with the Internet Education Foundation in 2016 and with the Global Network Initiative in 2017, and ICANN58 and ICANN 61 Fellow.

He has previously held a Presidential Scholar appointment from the Office of the Provost, for his first three years in the PhD program. During his academic tenure at Mason, David has worked as the Head Research Assistant on two National Science Foundation Grants, helping write one of them. His research area focuses broadly on technology policy and governance issues, with his dissertation dealing with multistakeholder governance institutions in IG.

David has worked on privacy, big data, security, open government data, social media, ethical implications of emerging technologies and numerous other tech policy topics.

His academic work mostly focuses on emerging technology governance, having explored biometrics, nanotechnology and the Internet, with an interest in exploring artificial intelligence.
